


## eBeam Projection Training for Mac (Interact 1.1 Software)

1. **Download software from [www.adamsbiz.com/gettingstarted](http://www.adamsbiz.com/gettingstarted). Click on the eBeam Scrapbook icon in your doc, and look for the Desktop Wheel to appear on your desktop.**
  - a. Learn how to access Options, Calibration (remember to calibrate slowly and accurately), Scrapbook and Annotation Wheels.
2. **Open up the Scrapbook Wheel from the Desktop Wheel.**
  - a. Become familiar with the Scrapbook Wheel (marker, highlighter, zoom, eraser, Text Box).
  - b. Bring in a background image:
    - i. Drag an image from your desktop.
    - ii. Go to Page, Add Image, Browse through your pictures and select an image, Click Open (you will see a preview), Click OK. Annotate over the background image.
    - iii. Bring in an image-based object from the image gallery. Go to the butterfly icon, click on Image Galleries, Click on an image and add it to your scrapbook page. Handles will appear for you to manipulate the image if desired.
    - iv. Capture a screen or a selected area of the screen using the camera.
  - c. Go up to the menu bar and click on the different page views (normal, thumbnail, full screen) and locate add, delete, and clear page.
  - d. Playback every page you have created in scrapbook. Go to View, Toolbars, Replay. Push play to see a playback of your scrapbook pages. **\*File must be saved as .esb for playback feature.**
  - e. Share a live web meeting:
    - i. Click on the “Share Meeting” icon. 
    - ii. Type in the meeting name, password, your name, and then click Share.
    - iii. Once connected, click on the finger pointer located on the Scrapbook Wheel.
    - iv. Open up the Participant Window to view participants who have joined.
    - v. Go to Sharing for Permit Annotations and Synchronize Participants.
    - vi. Click on the red stop sign located on menu bar to disconnect the meeting.
3. **Open up your web browser and go to an interactive website (notice the Desktop Wheel follows). Open up the Annotation Wheel from the Desktop Wheel.**
  - a. Begin annotating from the Annotation Wheel (marker, highlighter, shapes and arrows, eraser, and undo and redo).
  - b. Click on the mouse to exit Annotation mode. You can now save the annotations as a new scrapbook page if desired or choose “don’t save” to return to your interactive website.

**\*\*Remember to close out the software in 2 steps (scrapbook & desktop wheel)!**
